## Active Supervision

There is a relationship between the number of supervisor - to - student interactions and the instances of problem behavior (Simonsen, Fairbanks, Briesch, Myers & Sugai, 2008)

## Active Supervision...

- Has a positive impact on student behavior in a variety of settings- including classroom
- May reduce incidents of minor problem behavior
- May lead to increases in student engagement

Active supervision is a monitoring procedure that uses 3 components (DePry & Sugai, 2002) 1. Moving Effectively

- Constant
  - Make presence known and obvious Proximity to all students More frequent proximity to noncompliant students
- Randomized
- Targets Problem Areas

## 2. Scanning Effectively

- All students observed on a regular basis
- Make eye contact with students in more distant locations of the room
- Look and listen for signs of a problem

## 3. Interacting Frequently

- Positive contacts
  - Friendly, helpful, open demeanor Proactive, non-contingent High rate of delivery
- Positive reinforcement Immediate and contingent on behavior Delivered at high rates and consistently
- Corrective response Non-argumentative, non-critical Specific to behavior Systematic = correct, model, practice, reinforce
  - Deliver consequence Neutral. businesslike demeanor
    - Fair, non-arbitrary

"The goal of effective classroom management is not creating "perfect" children, but providing the <u>perfect environment</u> for enhancing their growth, using research-based strategies that guide students toward increasingly responsible and motivated behavior."
